

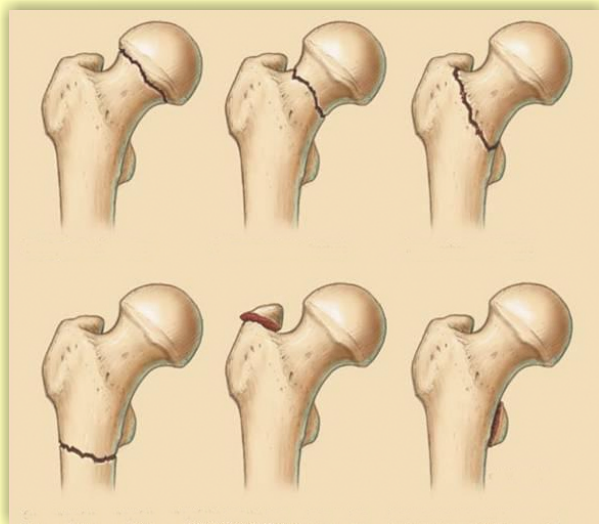

" WE COME INTO THE WORLD UNDER THE BRIM OF THE PELVIS AND GO OUT THROUGH THE NECK OF THE FEMUR " has been a constant refrain from our student days. Is it still true? The life time risk of sustaining a hip fracture is high and lies in the range of 40 to 50% in women and about 22% in men. Life expectancy is increasing and the burden of hip fractures is going to rise 6 fold from the present 1.6 million to 6.2 million in 2050. Pertrochanteric femoral neck fractures are of intense interest globally. They are the most frequently operated fracture type, have highest fatality rate of surgically treated fractures and have lead to poor functional recovery for the past 50 years. A new paradigm shift regarding hip fracture care and hip treatment is in evolution
